History of the Bitshares Wallet

- @cass and @svk individually had Worker Proposals throughout 2015/2016
- @billbutler had a worker proposal for project management in 2015/2016
- First coordinated effort for WP occurred on 2017/08/15, 1.14.58, <https://www.bitshares.foundation/workers/2017-08-bill-butler>
- Included a budget for sprint management, and a bounty system at \$125/hr for UI work



Why Worker proposal?

- Worker Proposals are built into the BTS Blockchain and provide a democratic way to distribute funds for projects
- It makes little sense to create many small worker proposals since they require a bit of lobbying to push through
- Allows for accountability of funds and the ability to “vote out” the proposal if the community is not deriving value



Methodology

- Anyone can claim an issue at <https://github.com/bitshares/bitshares-ui/issues>
- Work is estimated and is paid at \$125 per hour if merged into master
- Work is discussed in a threaded format to get clarification
- Programmers fork the work according guidelines and submit a PR (pull request)
- Pull Requests are incorporated into staging and after testing, merged into master



Accomplishments over past 12 months

- 238 bugs closed, 250 features added
- Updated, modern UI
- Improved Send / Receive / Deposit / Withdraw Modals
- Improved Voting
- Integrated industry standard TradingView into market exchange
- Improved node reliability
- Improved login process



Roadmap

- Dedicate UX/UI resource
- Flexible market exchange layouts
- ElasticSearch wrapper for lightning fast historical reporting
- Further UI enhancement / standards with ANT
- Responsive design for mobile
- BEET authentication engine / (scatter for bitshares)
